Welcome to the Summer Term!


Welcome back! We hope you had a chance to relax and enjoy the glorious sunshine over the Easter holidays and feel ready for a busy fun-filled summer term.

School Travel Plan

The School Travel Plan is a document which sets out a number of practical ways to reduce the amount of car runs made to and from school, to encourage more walking and cycling and to improve safety on the school journey.

Our objective is to raise awareness among pupils and parents of the harmful effects of increasing car use on children's health, safety and independence. It raises awareness of the implications of travel choice and the benefits of encouraging more sustainable travel to and from school. Hopefully, it will also lead to a benefit to the environment and, thus, to everyone.

Since 1985/86, the proportion of children nationally travelling to school by car has increased from 16% to 29%. Therefore, children are getting less exercise and have less opportunity to learn about their neighbourhood and about travelling independently.

By working together we can attempt to turn this trend around by:

- * Reducing accidents and danger on the journey to school
- Enabling parents and children to choose walking, cycling and public transport with confidence
- * Cutting congestion at the school gate
- Improving children's health and fitness through walking and cycling
- Equiping children with better road awareness and give them familiarity with public transport
- * Making the area round the school safer and more enjoyable for everyone.
