School reopens to children on Friday 6th January 2023













There has been an increase in the number of children arriving late into school. Please be reminded that soft start is from 8.45am and registration from 8.55am.

Please remember that being late:

- Gets your child's day off to a bad start
- Can be embarrassing for your child to walk into class late
- May lead to your child feeling confused all day! They will have missed out on vital instructions, information and bits of news at the start of the day
- Disrupts the lesson for everyone
- Creates a bad habit that is hard to break
- Can lead to the poor attendance If your child thinks that it is okay to be late for school they may soon think it's okay not to go to school.
