

Should There Be More Picture Rules For Trampolines?

A recent study, conducted by the British Medical Journal (BMJ) has found that trampolining is to blame for half of all activity-related UK Accident and Emergency (A&E) hospital admissions in under 14's. The report, published in the BMJ's Injury Prevention journal concluded, "trampolining is fun but potentially dangerous" after analysing 1.4 million trampolining injuries from around the world.
