Absence & Attendance

Well done to Nursery am, 1M, 4S & 6C who all achieved 100% attendance on the week commencing 8th March. Keep up the good work!

Please continue to follow guidelines and access the following link for further advice on Covid-19 symptoms and self isolation

Your child should only miss school is if they are too ill to attend. If this is the case, you should ring the school office by 9.30am and report the absence. Please state the reason why your child is not coming into school; please do not simply state they are unwell as you will receive a call requesting further information regarding their symptoms.

We do not expect children to miss school for minor ailments e.g. seasonal colds & coughs (incl. hay fever) tiredness, birthdays and family parties. If your child has a temperature, vomiting or diarrhoea they should return to school 48hrs after their last episode. Click here for a useful guide to assist you with childhood illnesses. If you are not sure in the morning whether your child is well enough for school, we suggest you send them in. We can always call you if they become too ill to get through the day.

Authorisation for absence will not be given for outings, shopping trips or family visits. Holidays should be taken during the school breaks and not during term time. Our Term Dates for 2021-22 can be found here.

Medical appointments should be made out of school hours if possible. If your child has to see a doctor or dentist in school time (appointment cards, letters & texts) must be submitted as evidence and they should attend school for as much of the day as possible. It is not permitted to take a whole day off school for a medical appointment unless the appointment lasts all day.

Punctuality

Please ensure your children arrive into school on time. Pupils who arrive late after 8.45am for (Nursery, 2, 4 & 6), 9.00am (years 1,3,& 5) and 9.15am (reception) must enter through the main office and sign in. This is essential for your child to be correctly registered. If you are unavoidably delayed please call the school office to notify them and also book your child's school dinner (This must be before 9.30am). Children who arrive late into school miss out on important learning. It makes for a bad start to their day as it can be upsetting for the children and disruptive to the teacher and other pupils. Arrival after 9.25am is considered half a day's absence.

All lateness/attendance is recorded and monitored by the school and the Education Welfare Officer. Please speak with Mrs Kennedy, Attendance Officer for further advice and guidance


