Should We Always Be Prepared For An Emergency?

The UK government has launched a new website, prepare. Campaign.gov.uk, designed to help people plan for potential dangers and equip themselves with the necessary knowledge and resources to respond effectively. Households are encouraged to understand the hazards in their local area by checking their long-term flood risk and signing up for flood and

weather warnings. Creating an emergency plan is another key aspect of being prepared, including deciding on escape routes and keeping important phone

numbers to hand.
