

Attendance & Punctuality

As you are aware good attendance and punctuality are essential for your children to make good progress and achieve their full potential.

Establish good attendance habits – show your children that it is important

Only keep your child off school if they are unwell

Arrange for a friend to take your child to school if a sibling is unwell, you are unwell or you have an appointmentIt is not fair that your child misses out on learning

Establish a good bedtime routine, so your child can sleep well, get enough sleep and make mornings less of a struggle!

Talk to us – we may be able to help and support you and your child

If your child is unwell please contact school and report the absence on the first day providing an explanation of the symptoms. If your child experiences vomiting, temperature or diarrhoea they are required to remain away from school for 48 hrs (even if your child feels well enough to return) to avoid possible spread of infection. For all other illnesses the NHS provide a helpful guide to assist you whether your child is too ill to attend school https://www.nhs.uk/live-well/healthy-body/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/

Make doctors/dentist appointments outside school hours

If this is not possible try to make an appointment first thing in the morning or late afternoon so that your child does not miss a whole day of school.

Punctuality

Your child should be in school on time. It is important that your child arrives ready to start the day calmly as well as ensuring they do not valuable learning time. Punctuality can also affect attendance as any child arriving after registers close will be marked absent for the morning session.

Collecting your child on time at the end of the school day is very important too.

Please remember holidays and unauthorised absences during term time may result in a Penalty Notice being issued. All absence requests must be made in advance in writing to Mr Henry, Headteacher.
