Get Active With Street Tag!

We are delighted to announce that Barley Lane will be participating in the Street Tag Redbridge Primary Schools Leaderboard

from 19th October 2020 to 8th Jan 2021.

Street Tag brings families and communities together by turning streets and green spaces into a virtual playground, encouraging families to get active through walking, running and cycling. The more active you are, the more points you earn for rewards.

How to participate in Street Tag

Install the <u>Street Tag</u> app on the App Store or Play Store (or at www.streettag.co.uk). Join the school team by scanning the QR Code below

During the Street Tag experience, families can record their distance walked by scanning virtual tags (each tag is worth 10 points on average) at various locations, converting steps into points. Watch your points climb up the school leader-board and earn prizes. There will be prizes for the top 3 schools on the leaderboard:



As part of Black History Month, children in Year 5 have been learning about black Tudors and what life would have been like during the Tudor period.

We focused our learning on John Blanke, a Tudor musician, who showcased his musical talents at King Henry VIII's court. The children looked at an image of the musician taken from The Westminster Tournament Roll, which as painted in 1511. Using the image and historical

sources, children made their own conclusions about John Blanke's experience living in Tudor England.
