Curtis and Mrs Qayum, our maths leaders.



Should sportswear be banned if it gives an unfair advantage?

Nike Vaporfly trainers, which have revolutionised running allowing runners to break world marathon records, have been given the green light by World Athletics. In a long-awaited ruling the World Athletics, who are the sport's governing body, confirmed that Nike Vaporflys, which cost £240 and can improve marathon times by one-to-two minutes in elite athletes, are legally allowable despite many in the sport accusing the shoes of providing a huge advantage for runners.

Things to discuss at home with your children:

In sporting competitions, it's important that things are fair for all competitors.

If the Nike trainers are banned for professional athletes for making things unfair, should they be banned for everyone else too? Why?
