Holocaust Memorial Trip

Barley Lane Primary was represented by eight year 4 children at the Holocaust Memorial Event this week. The children joined hundreds of others in Valentines Park, Ilford, to remember those killed during the Holocaust under Nazi persecution, as well as those who have suffered in genocides in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur. The children, who learned about Judaism in the autumn term, gained a lot from the experience.
