

The retailer Marks and Spencer (M&S) has begun legal action against supermarket Aldi, arguing the supermarket's Cuthbert the Caterpillar cake infringes its Colin the Caterpillar trademark. M&S claim that their similarity leads consumers to believe they are of the same standard and "rides on the coat-tails" of M&S's reputation. M&S wants Aldi to remove the product from sale and agree not to sell anything similar in the future.

Our industry leading Pabulum Dining Experience focuses on creating a social, family experience at lunchtimes promoting interaction between the children. Our food choices promote healthy eating and encourage the children to experience

a wide range of tastes and flavours. We firmly believe that children are more likely to eat what they themselves have chosen.

While we are confident that our menus meet the needs of the pupils at Barley Lane Primary School, it is really important for us to understand the views of our parents/carers and the children. For parents, we will be conducting surveys to understand your views about the meals that we provide for your children. For the children, we will be introducing 'Your Voice Matters' feedback stations into the dining hall (for a week, every half term) where we will be asking the children to rate their dining experience with us by choosing one of four face icons (sad to smiley) on the tablet. We will be working with the Barley Lane Primary School Council on this – more news on this to follow...

In addition to our great tasting menus, we have a number of exciting initiatives planned for later this year including the Great British Food Festival, Whole School Fundraising (linked to meal uptake) and Your Planet Matters.

School lunches are priced at £2.25 per day and offer great value for money. For children in KS1 (Reception, Years 1 & 2), and for children entitled to free school meals, there is no charge to parents so sign your children up to our delicious lunches and help fuel your children's minds and bodies for learning.
